And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching." -- Hebrews 10:23b-25

Habits. Most of us can easily tell you what good habits we have, and we usually have guite a list of bad habits that we want to overcome, too. And this time of year - when we transition from one year to the next - is when we resolve to change some of those habits. Sometimes the habits stick, often they don't. It really depends on how intent we are on keeping them and whether we have a good plan or method in place.

Many of you know that Methodist is not a term that John Wesley and the other founders of our movement came up with for themselves. They called themselves "The Holy Club." How different would we be today if that was still our moniker? No, it was outsiders who noticed how methodical they were in living out their faith. These outsiders first labeled us "Methodists." We would probably do well to follow the holy habits of our founders a lot more closely. As the Methodist movement expanded, they settled on three simple rules (habits!) for living. We call them the General Rules. They are all guite short and simple -

- 1. Do no harm.
- 2. Do good.
- 3. Follow the Ordinances of God.

The first two are pretty self-explanatory. The third is pretty outdated in it's language, but it basically means to follow the basic practices that keep someone in close touch with God. They include things like prayer, bible reading and study, worship, the sacraments, fasting and abstinence. While these items are not a "magic formula" to live a Godly life, they are the practices or "method" by which Christians have kept their hearts in the right place for thousands of years. Others have rebranded this third rule to say "Stay in Love with God" to emphasize the intended outcome.

Beginning the second Sunday of January, we are going to spend a week with each of the General Rules. I know you've gone over them before here, but they are nothing more than basic Christian life practices. We can't be reminded of such things too often.

In the meantime, I hope that you will take inventory of your life and see what spiritual practices you have neglected. Resolve to make them regular, methodical practices in your life. As the scripture reminds us, God is unfailingly faithful to us. May we be faithful in return. Happy New Year!
